Vulnerable Christians Need Your Support to Rebuild their Lives *(Jeremiah 29:11)*

Rebuilding Lives:

Iraqi Christians, at the hands of ISIS, have witnessed and experienced things that nobody should ever have to endure.

As a Christian charity we reflect God's love for the most vulnerable people in the Middle East, regardless of their religion or background.

We offer hope, help and healing to enable refugees and Iraqis to get their lives back on track. We do this by working closely with local churches and Christian partnership organisations.



Aid for the most vulnerable

Food vouchers, clothing, medical care and safe sanctuary places.

Education for the Children

Mosaic Middle East also offers an education for the children and provides music and arts therapeutic classes. Mosaic also provides sports equipment to the children who have spent their entire lives in refugee and displacement camps.



Olive Tree Centres

Mosaic offers practical support to the refugees in Jordan through our local network of 'Olive Tree' Centres, which are linked to local Christian Churches and partner organisations. The centres are a haven for refugees.

They can pick up new skills, attain qualifications and have a safe place to work through their trauma with psycho-social support. Activities include: art, writing, music, woodwork, sewing, crafting, gardening and cookery, etc.

"It is through the centre that people are coming to know God. Once they see the love in action they are more open." Said, Pastor Zaki.
